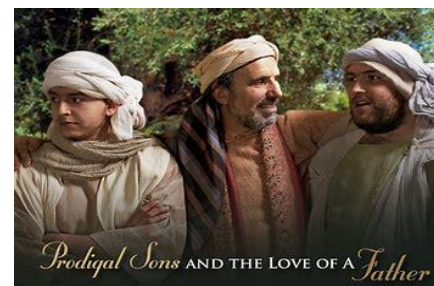

(Gospel continued)

<sup>21</sup> And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned  
against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy  
to be called your son

' <sup>22</sup> But the father said to his servants, 'Bring  
quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring  
on his hand, and shoes on his feet. <sup>23</sup> And bring the  
fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and  
celebrate. <sup>24</sup> For this my son was dead, and is alive  
again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to  
celebrate. <sup>25</sup> "Now his older son was in the field, and as  
he came and drew near to the house, he heard music  
and dancing. <sup>26</sup> And he called one of the servants and  
asked what these things meant. <sup>27</sup> And he said to him,  
'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the  
fatted calf, because he has received him back safe  
and sound.' <sup>28</sup> But he was angry and refused to go in.  
His father came out and entreated him, <sup>29</sup> but he  
answered his father, 'Look, these many years I have  
served you, and I never disobeyed your command,  
yet you never gave me a young goat, that I  
might celebrate with my friends. <sup>30</sup> But when this son  
of yours came, who has devoured your property with  
prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!' <sup>31</sup> And  
he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all  
that is mine is yours. <sup>32</sup> It was fitting to celebrate and  
be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive;  
he was lost, and is found.'"

### READING OF THE GOSPEL OF LUKE 15:1-3, 11-32 - (Terry)

Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him.<sup>2</sup> And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them."<sup>3</sup> So he told them this parable:<sup>11</sup> "There was a man who had two sons.<sup>12</sup> And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.' And he divided his property between them.<sup>13</sup> Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living.<sup>14</sup> And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, and he began to be in need.<sup>15</sup> So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs.<sup>16</sup> And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything.<sup>17</sup> "But when he came to himself, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have more than enough bread, but I perish here with hunger!<sup>18</sup> I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you."<sup>19</sup> I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Treat me as one of your hired servants.'" <sup>20</sup> And he arose and came to his father.

But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion and ran and embraced him and kissed him.

## READING OF THE OLD TESTAMENT – ISAIAH 43:16–21

Thus says the LORD, who makes a way in the sea,  
a path in the mighty waters,<sup>17</sup> who brings forth  
chariot and horse, army and warrior;  
they lie down, they cannot rise, they are  
extinguished, quenched like a wick:

<sup>18</sup> “Remember not the former things,  
nor consider the things of old. <sup>19</sup> Behold, I am  
doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not  
perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness  
and rivers in the desert. <sup>20</sup> The wild beasts will  
honor me, the jackals and the ostriches,  
for I give water in the wilderness, rivers in the  
desert, to give drink to my chosen people,  
<sup>21</sup> the people whom I formed for myself that they  
might declare my praise.

## READING OF EPISTLE OF PHILIPPIANS 3:4–14 (Terry)

If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: <sup>5</sup>circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; <sup>6</sup>as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless. <sup>7</sup>But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. <sup>8</sup>Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ <sup>9</sup>and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith— <sup>10</sup>that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, <sup>11</sup>that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

<sup>12</sup>Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. <sup>13</sup>Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, <sup>14</sup>I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.
