## **THANKSGIVING**

(based on the teachings of the apostle Paul)

"Thanksgiving" was very much a part of the apostle Paul's vocabulary. The words "give thanks", or simply "thanks" run through his writings in the New Testament like a thread, expressing an attitude on his part which should be the attitude of each one of us as Christians as we approach Thanksgiving season.

At Thanksgiving our thoughts turn toward the material blessings and benefits of life, which are part of God's proverbial care. We think of peaceful homes, healthful days, family gatherings, turkey dinners, football games, and that "too full" feeling that usually comes after a big Thanksgiving feast. Certainly, material blessings are a source of our thanksgiving. Family, food, fellowship – all good!

But Paul, as he uses the word in his biblical writings, would lead us deeper into the whole matter of what thanksgiving is all about. Let's capture the spirit of his attitude about thanksgiving by taking a quick trip through some of his writings.

Paul expressed thanksgiving that he was chosen to share in the ministry and mission of Christ (even as we are). "I thank Jesus Christ, our Lord, whose power has been in me. He thought I could be trusted, and appointed me to do His work, even though I used to slander, persecute, and shamefully mistreat Him." (1 Timothy 1:12-13)

A thought which Paul shares at the beginning of several of his letters in the Bible is his thanksgiving for the people he served, as he remembers them and prays for them. "I thank God when I remember you in my prayers", he writes to young Timothy. (2 Timothy 1:3) He has similar thoughts when he writes to the congregation in Rome, rejoicing with them in their new found faith in Christ: "First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because the news of your faith is spreading all over the world." (Romans 1:8) He expresses the same thought in writing to that problem-ridden Corinthian congregation: "I am always thanking God for you, because He has loved you in Christ Jesus and in Him made you rich in every way." (1 Corinthians 1:4-5) Writing to Philemon the slave he says: "I'm always thanking my God when I mention you in my prayers, because I hear how you believe in the Lord Jesus and love Him and all the holy people." (Philemon 1:4-5)

Twice in his letter to the Colossians, Paul mentions thanksgiving as a key ingredient in our faith: "Just as you accepted Christ Jesus as your Lord, so live in Him. In Him be rooted, strengthened, and built up in your faith, as you were taught, and overflow with thanksgiving." (Colossians 2:6-7) "Keep on praying, watch as you pray, and give thanks." (Colossians 4:2)

For Paul, the source of personal thanksgiving was his relationship with Christ and the joy it brought to him to be able to share the good news of Christ with others as an apostle. For him, thanksgiving went beyond the material level to the deepest level of spiritual reality, everything that life as a servant of Jesus Christ meant to him, as he summarizes this in one final passage we want to make reference to: "Thanks be to God for His gift which is more than we can tell!" (2 Corinthians 9:15)

As we approach Thanksgiving Day 2024, I pray that we Christians, who make up our New Beginnings Lutheran Church family of believers, may find our real source of meaning for this day in the attitude and example of the apostle Paul.

I close with three scripture verses on which to reflect as we celebrate another Thanksgiving season:

- Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His love endures forever. (1 Corinthians 16:34)
- I will praise God's name in song, and glorify Him with thanksgiving. (Psalm 69:30)
- You will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous in every way.
   Such generosity produces thanksgiving to God through us. (2 Corinthians 9:11)
